DAYS OF DIALOGUE IS... FACILITATED DIALOGUE

- Structured Conversation
- The facilitator acts as a moderator, rather than a leader and is always neutral
- The purpose is to share Thoughts, Feelings, and Experiences in a safe and confidential space



DIALOGUE PARTICIPANTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO...

- Express your opinions
- Listen to others
- Give everyone a chance to speak
- Respect the ground rules
- Respect each other



GROUND RULES

- Speak openly and honestly
- Listen carefully and respectfully to each person
- Keep comments brief and stay focused on task
- Explore differences respectfully and look for common ground
- Trust that the facilitator has the best interest of the group at heart
- Silence cell phones
- Be respectful of the opinions of others




PRE-DIALOGUE SURVEY RESULTS




ETHNICITY










IS LAW ENFORCEMENT ADEQUATELY ADDRESSING THE CONCERNS OF THE COMMUNITY?

- Media, movies, games give bad perceptions of African Americans, Latinos, Asians etc. Stereotypes unhelpful.
- Very few positive stories about police in the media.
- Community policing is the future.
- Misconceptions on both sides.
- We need to go a little bit further to build trust.
- We need to put attention on our youth.

- Why are there so many homeless when there are so many resources?
- There are programs but it will take a while for progress to be made.
- Use social media to report negative things, remember we are all citizens.
- If you're going to own a gun, you need to go to school to learn how to operate that weapon.
- We can't put the entire burden on the police department.
- Community forums like this one are great but there need to be more interpreters.

- More efforts for this kind of events to take place, so relationships between community and LAPD are more transparent. And we can build more trust.
- Invite Neighborhood Watch Groups to these events.
- Very important for children to see police officers in positive light.
 There is no more D.A.R.E. program but there is a Cadet program.
- What is the problem to get more traffic lights?
- Magnolia Pico Neighborhood Watch Supports LAPD. Feel that the police are doing a great job to keep the area clean and safe.



- Cultures sometimes clash.
- Using race is an excuse.
- For me, a uniform is a form of respect and that doesn't mean we can't be friends.
- Not all interactions with police are negative. Community soccer and football games with LAPD are good.
- LAPD We are trying to improve interaction with community.
- Language can be a barrier.



- Suggestion: Community resources team to help improve communities throughout Los Angeles. Is there a resource for that?
- Community pride helps to improve relationships.
- Keep good contact with SLO.
- How to build trust with Central American undocumented communities when people come from countries where police are not trusted at all?
- Social media feeds negative perception of police.



- Very few illegally own guns in this community. More guns do not make the community more safe. More safety education on guns is needed.
- For people who get guns, more training should be required.
 40 hours?
- Guns give a false sense of security.
- There are some who think that police should be inside the schools, but-rather-counselors, teachers and therapists.
- The dual role of officers to protect and also to mentor in the schools.



- Should police partners be diverse for better understanding of culture?
- Funding is a problem for mental health education. LAPD does have a Mental Evaluation Unit and SMART teams.
- "Smart Teams" = one officers, one partner who is a clinician.
- Work around the stigma: need more mental illness awareness, more accessibility, more funding.
- Culture sensitivity training for LAPD and community.



- Police need to go to school to engage with the students.
 This way the kids take the message back to the home and inform the family of positive talks with police.
- Parents should not instill fear in young children about police.
- Korean culture Language barrier, cultural getting police involved is embarrassing. Not many Korean police officers in LAPD.
- Many Koreans feel unsafe in their community walking home.
- In Korea, the police are more integrated in community.




- Pre-existing conditions for homelessness- Learning disability, domestic violence, embarrassment.
- Need developers for affordable housing.
- Homelessness... HOPE VILLAGE- offers rehabilitation, health care, job training, it's a one-year commitment.
- How many good things are there that happen with police that no one knows about?
- The entire society has to be involved, you can't put it off on the police, the education system or parents alone. We all need to be involved to make the community better.

There are crimes on Pico and accidents, traffic division needs to provide statistics and take steps to set up a light.

There are friendly relationships between the community and police officers.



It's important to provide the appropriate/relevant contact information for the correct division and community.



It can be a conflict to contact police to help when they hurt or arrest you.



Know your community and all available resources.







HAVE YOUR **OPINIONS CHANGED** AS A **RESULT OF THIS DIALOGUE?**







