DAYS OF DIALOGUE IS... FACILITATED DIALOGUE

- Structured Conversation
- The facilitator acts as a moderator, rather than a leader and is always neutral
- The purpose is to share Thoughts, Feelings, and Experiences in a safe and confidential space



DIALOGUE PARTICIPANTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO...

- Express your opinions
- Listen to others
- Give everyone a chance to speak
- Respect the ground rules
- Respect each other



GROUND RULES

- Speak openly and honestly
- Listen carefully and respectfully to each person
- Keep comments brief and stay focused on task
- Explore differences respectfully and look for common ground
- **Trust** that the facilitator has the best interest of the group at heart
- Silence cell phones
- Be respectful of the opinions of others







HAVE YOUR OPINIONS CHANGED AS A RESULT OF THIS DIALOGUE?











IS LAW ENFORCEMENT ADEQUATELY ADDRESSING THE CONCERNS OF THE COMMUNITY?










Messages

In some situations, when someone is pulled over because they look suspicious for some reason - they just never know.






I learned how to differentiate the areas: San Fernando and Los Angeles.

What do the officers do when they are done patrolling?


We talked about a lot of the stresses that officers have.












How do you keep a good relationship going on with your family?

Officers said - it's good to have other activities that you do together. Like break dancing! And acting?






I would want to make possible an assembly, with a panel and inviting officers and news reporters to record good and not just the bad.
