DAYS OF DIALOGUE IS... FACILITATED DIALOGUE

- Structured Conversation
- The facilitator acts as a moderator, rather than a leader and is always neutral
- The purpose is to share Thoughts, Feelings, and Experiences in a safe and confidential space



DIALOGUE PARTICIPANTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO...

- Express your opinions
- Listen to others
- Give everyone a chance to speak
- Respect the ground rules
- Respect each other



GROUND RULES

- Speak openly and honestly
- Listen carefully and respectfully to each person
- Keep comments brief and stay focused on task
- Explore differences respectfully and look for common ground
- Trust that the facilitator has the best interest of the group at heart
- Silence cell phones
- Be respectful of the opinions of others



GENDER






ETHNICITY






AGE

3) What is your AGE?








AFFILIATION


4) What is your AFFILIATION?








IS LAW ENFORCEMENT ADEQUATELY ADDRESSING THE CONCERNS OF THE COMMUNITY?










HAVE YOUR OPINIONS CHANGED AS A RESULT OF THIS DIALOGUE?













DO YOU BELIEVE THAT PEOPLE OF COLOR ARE


WHAT, IF ANY, ACTION(S) DO YOU EXPECT TO TAKE AS A RESULT OF THIS DIALOGUE?

We would like to see direct outreach in the community, to recruit black and brown, starting in kindergarten, to go to the Academy.





We need to encourage our kids to be "squares." Show our kids how to be doctors, research analysts, lawyers... We need more professionals coming out of our community.



Officers are people too. Everyone can have a bad day. We talked about the steps that are taken to de-escalate a situation. The key here is communication.

How can we get the community more engaged? When officers are driving down the street fast- maybe they could slow down- and wave to the kids- and SMILE.

There used to be more respect for the community members, and there used to be more respect for officers. We long for that day.



The media should cover the positive as well as the negative, for example, we would love to see on TV a piece about officers in Southeast who walk the children to school. Let's highlight the positive.

It's valuable to get together to talk like this. Makes us realize that we have more in common than we typically realize.

Let's set up a community bulletin board- if anyone hits the lottery, please start an online bulletin board for South Los Angeles, so that we can all know when things are going on.



Issue is that in the home, many African Americans look down on officers and discourage their children from joining the force. However, there is an undeniable need! This culture shift has to start in the home, when the children are very young.

There are problems happening in the community. People see the negative things with the police rather than the positive things.





There are huge resources in the community.

Law enforcement's responsibility is to be part of the community.






The Days of Dialogue is important because it can build the relationship between law enforcement and the community. People can get to know the police officers in their community.
