### DAYS OF DIALOGUE IS... FACILITATED DIALOGUE

- Structured Conversation
- The facilitator acts as a moderator, rather than a leader and is always neutral
- The purpose is to share Thoughts, Feelings, and Experiences in a safe and confidential space



### DIALOGUE PARTICIPANTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO...

- Express your opinions
- Listen to others
- Give everyone a chance to speak
- Respect the ground rules
- Respect each other



### **GROUND RULES**

- Speak openly and honestly
- Listen carefully and respectfully to each person
- Keep comments brief and stay focused on task
- Explore differences respectfully and look for common ground
- Trust that the facilitator has the best interest of the group at heart
- Silence cell phones
- Be respectful of the opinions of others




### What is your GENDER?





### **ETHNICITY**


### What is your Ethnicity? MARK ALL THAT APPLY





### **AGE**


### What is your AGE?






### **AFFILIATION**

#### What is your AFFILIATION?










When comparing treatment of community members by law enforcement, do you believe that LGBTQ people are consistently treated less fairly by law enforcement officers than are non-LGBTQ people?






### HAVE YOUR OPINIONS CHANGED AS A RESULT OF THIS DIALOGUE?








