DAYS OF DIALOGUE IS... FACILITATED DIALOGUE

- *Structured* Conversation
- The facilitator acts as a *moderator*, rather than a leader and is always neutral
- The purpose is to share *Thoughts, Feelings, and Experiences* in a safe and confidential space

DIALOGUE PARTICIPANTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO...

- Express your *opinions*
- *Listen* to others
- Give *everyone* a chance to speak
- Respect the *ground rules*
- *Respect* each other

GROUND RULES

- Speak openly and *honestly*
- *Listen* carefully and respectfully to each person
- Keep comments *brief* and stay focused on task
- Explore differences *respectfully* and look for common ground
- *Trust* that the facilitator has the best interest of the group at heart
- *Silence* cell phones
- Be *respectful* of the opinions of others

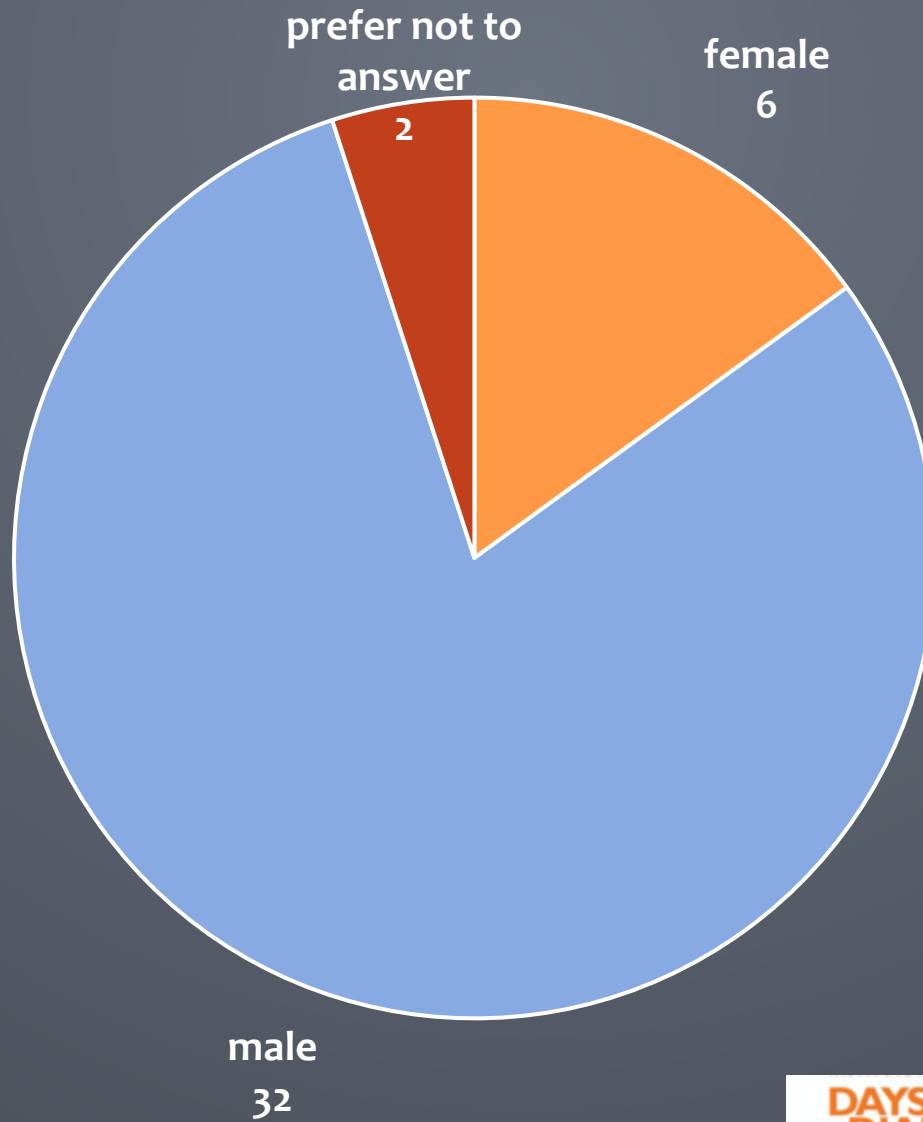

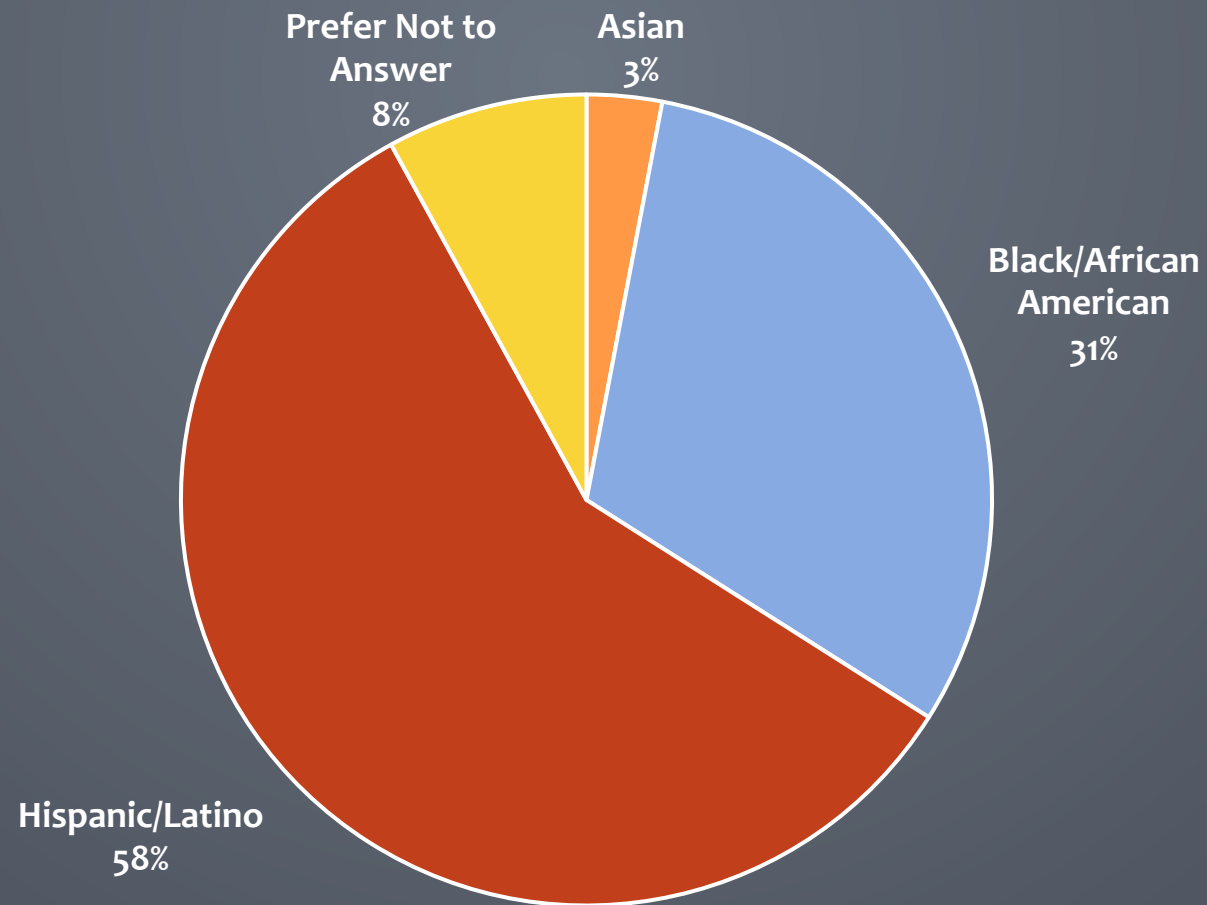

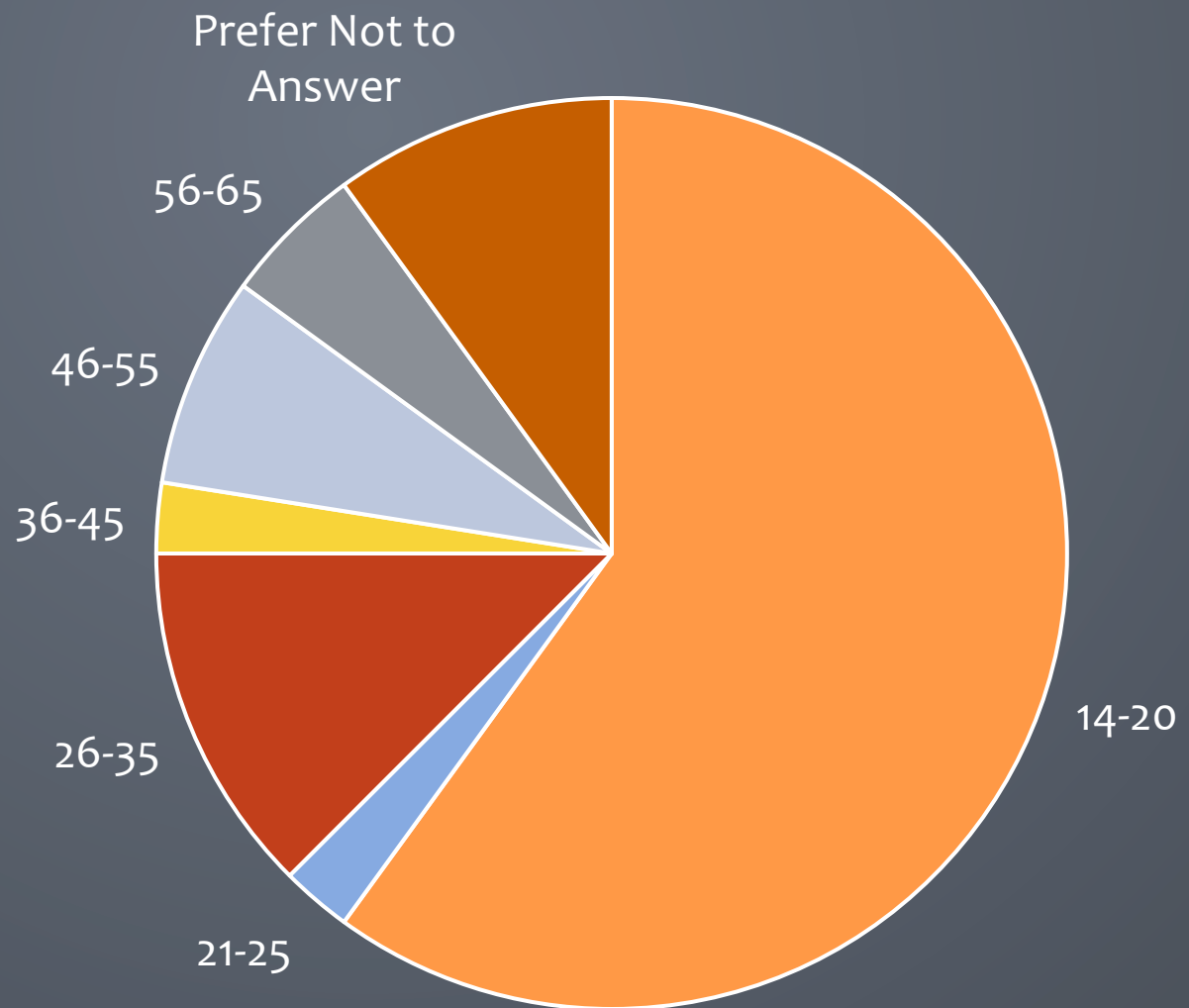

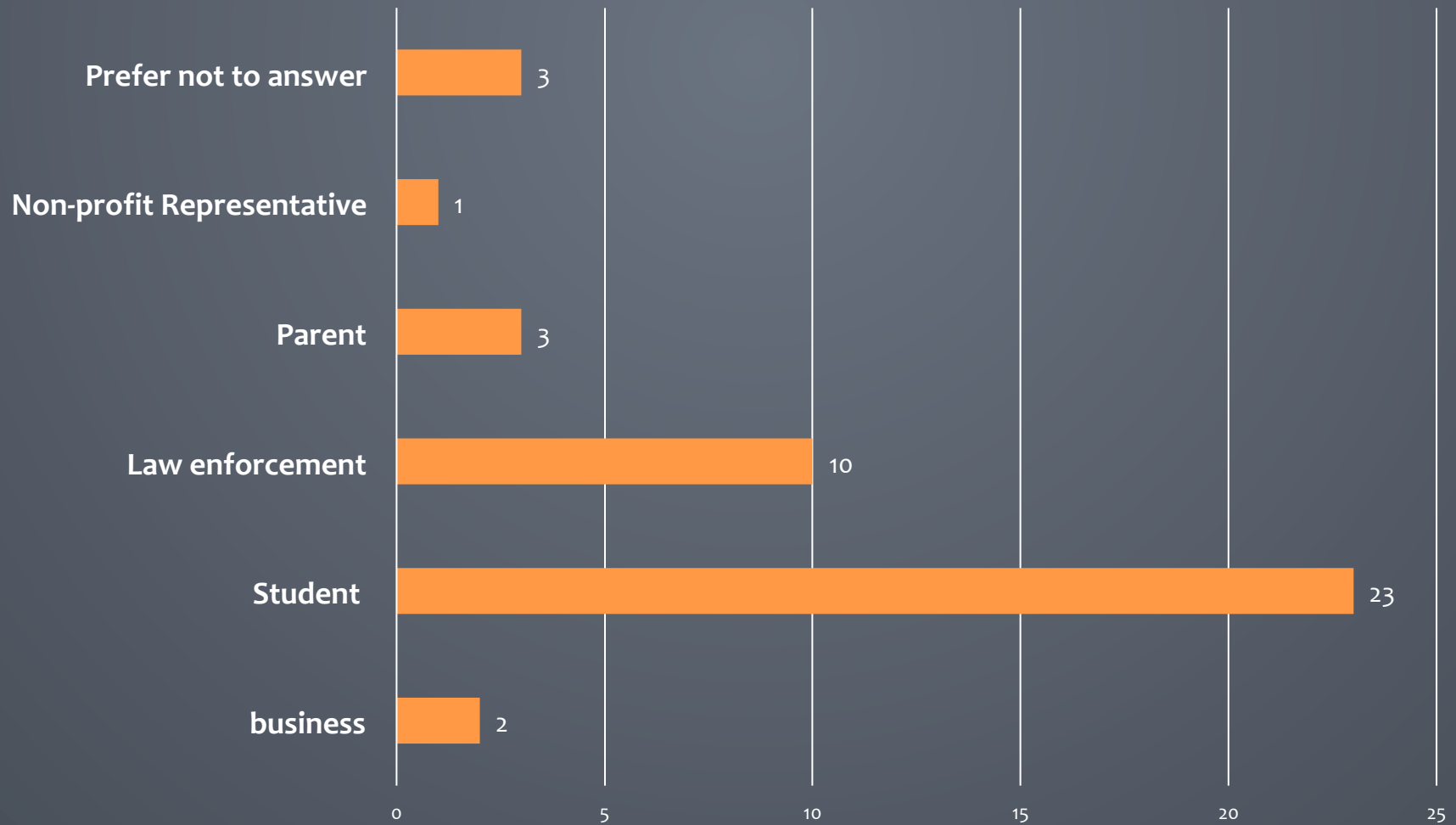

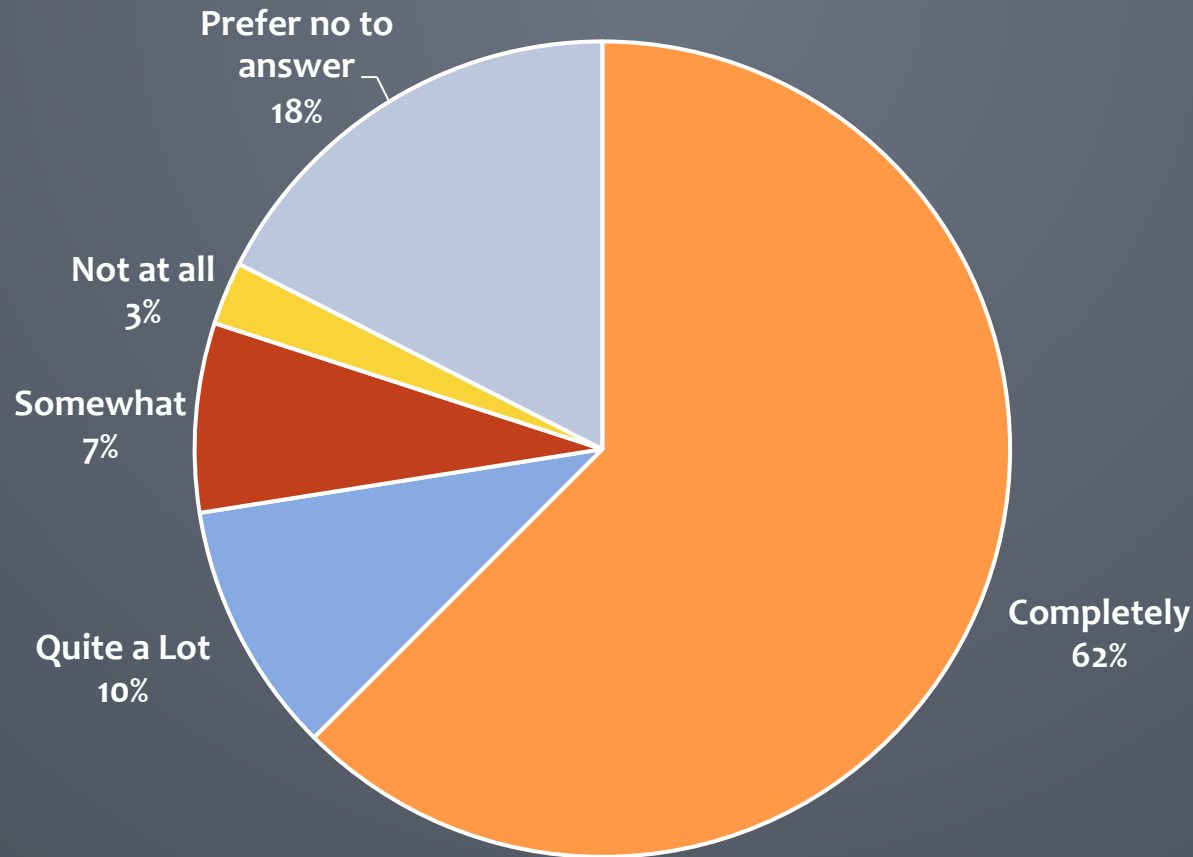

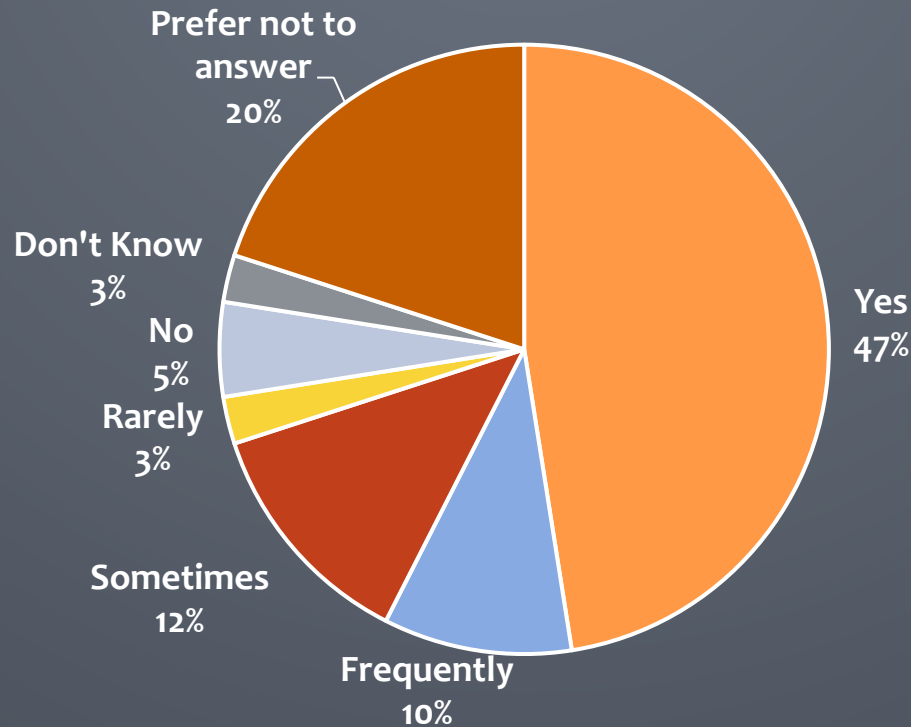

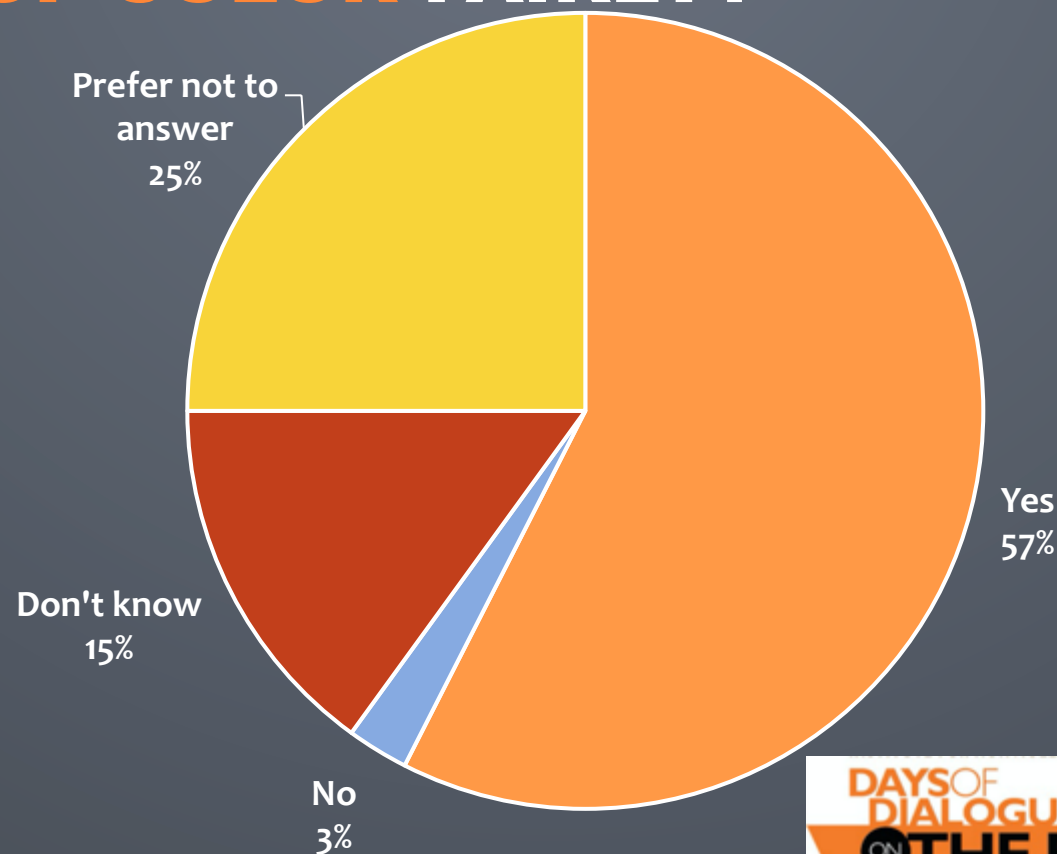
ARE YOU IN **CHARGE** OF **YOUR** **LIFE**?



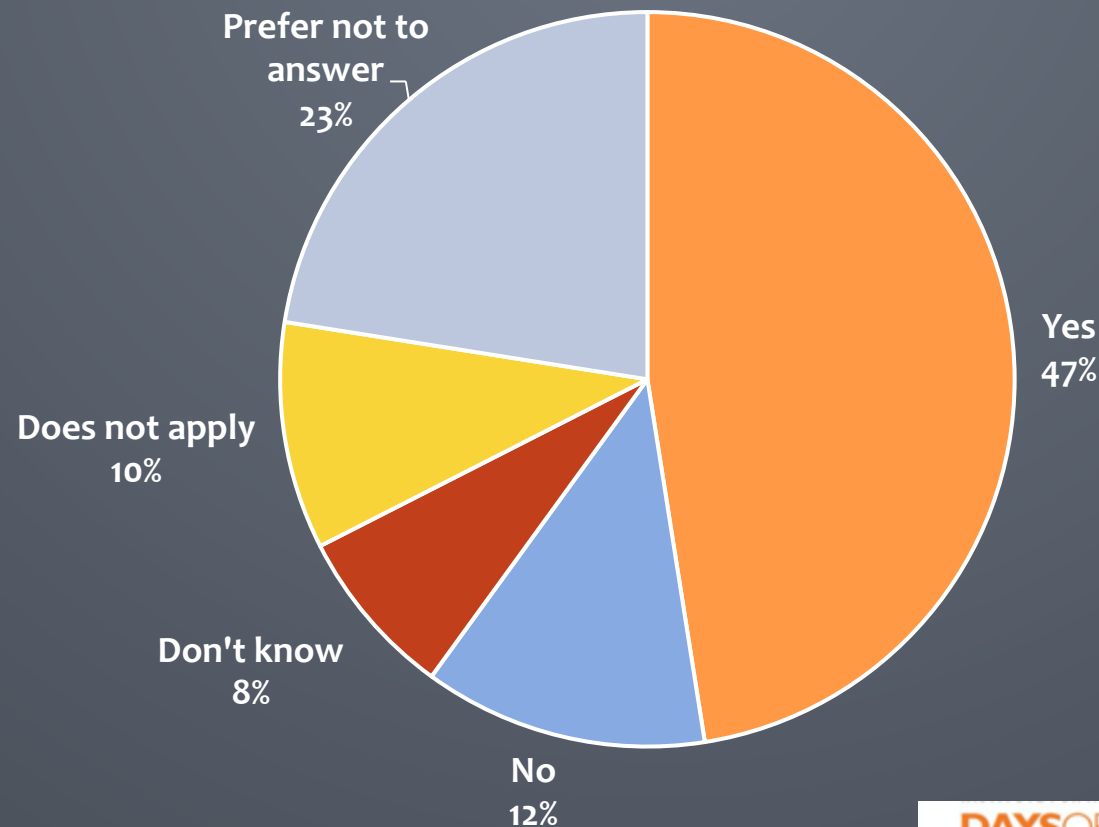

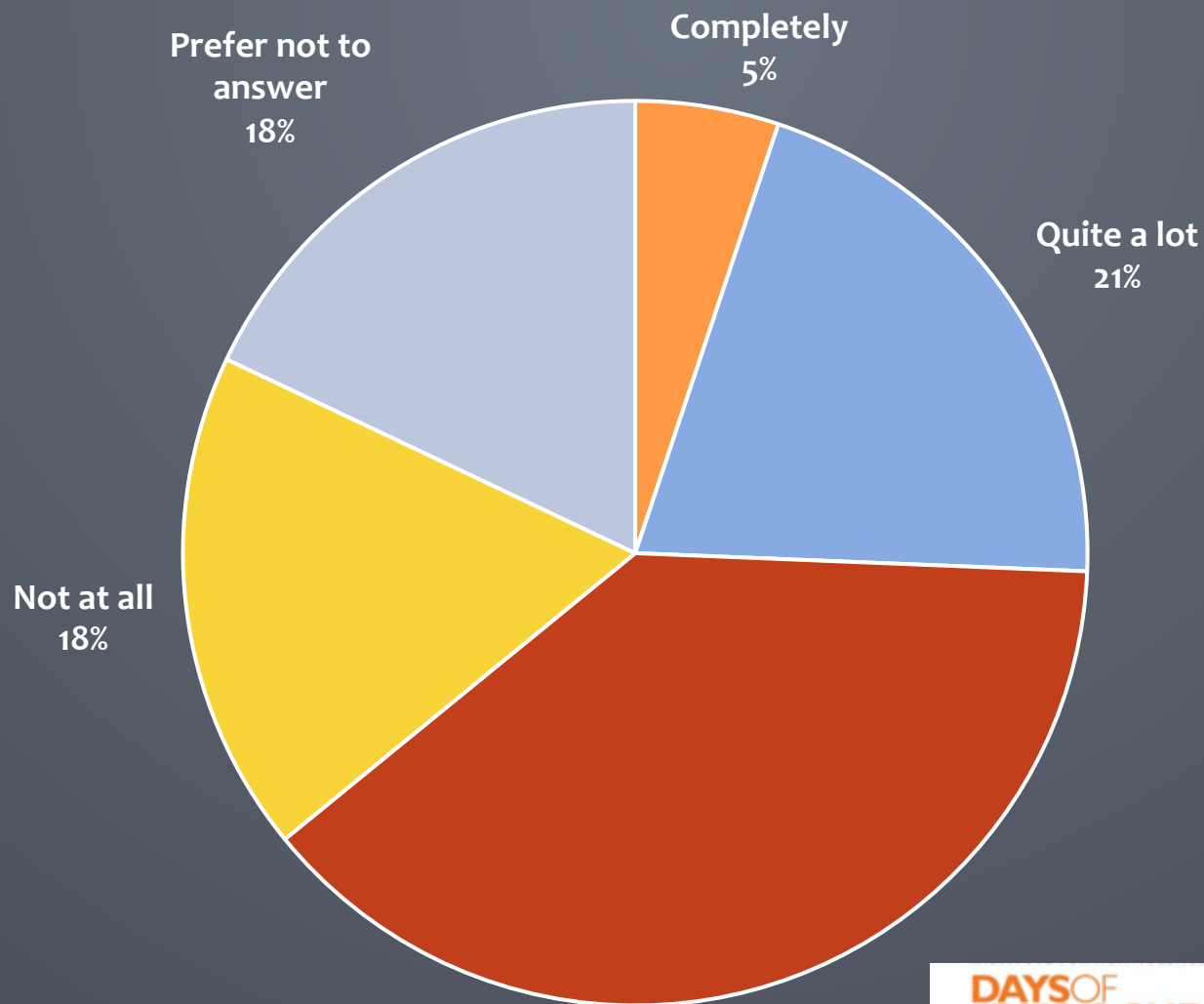

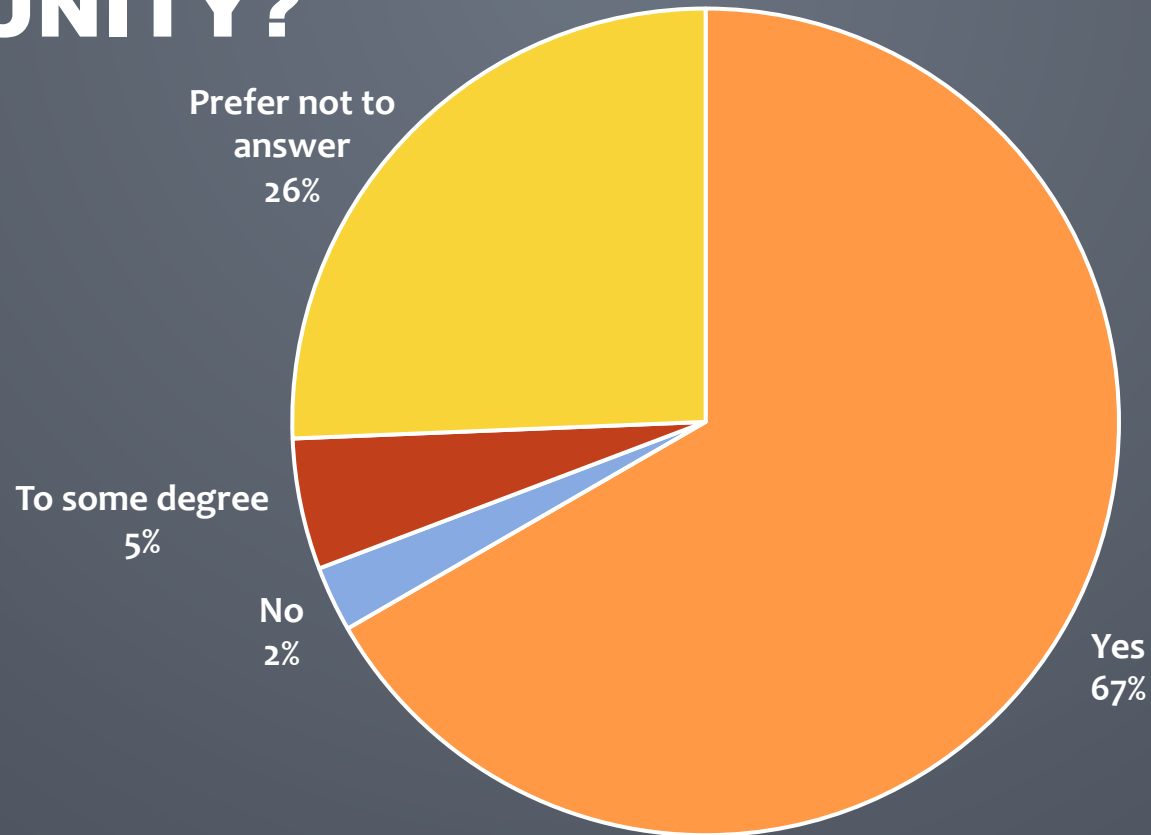
POST-DIALOGUE SURVEY RESULTS

HAVE YOUR **OPINIONS CHANGED** AS A RESULT OF **THIS DIALOGUE**?

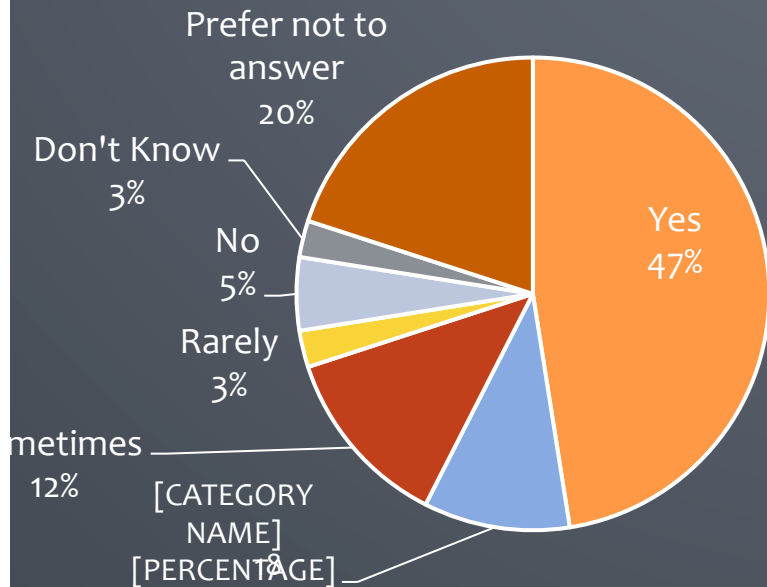

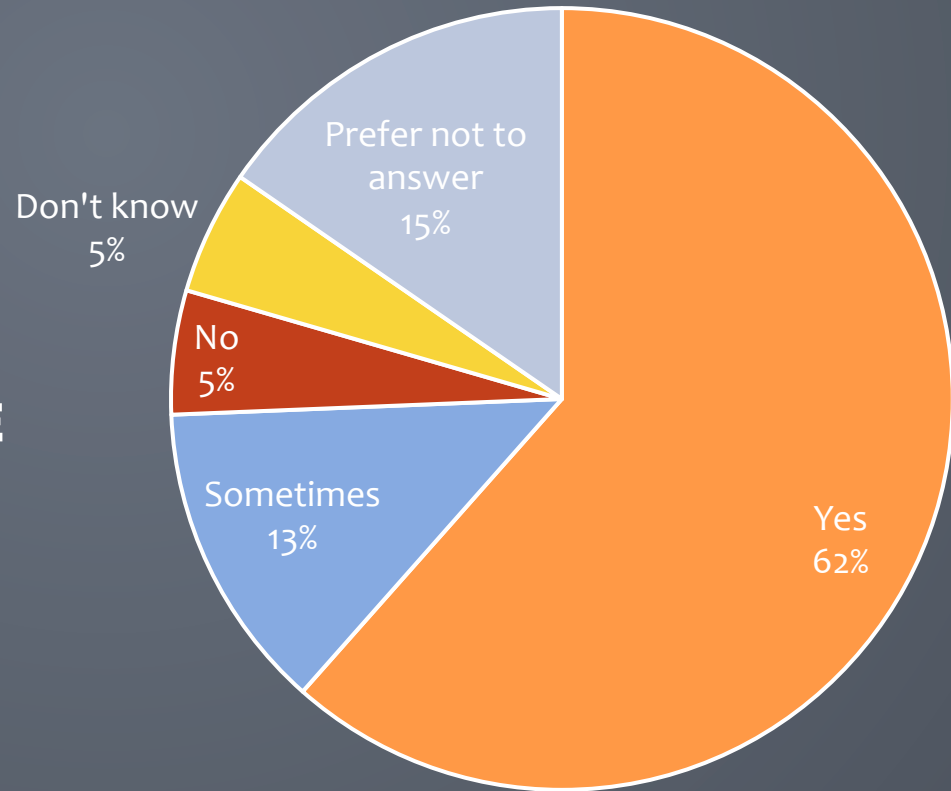


WHEN COMPARING

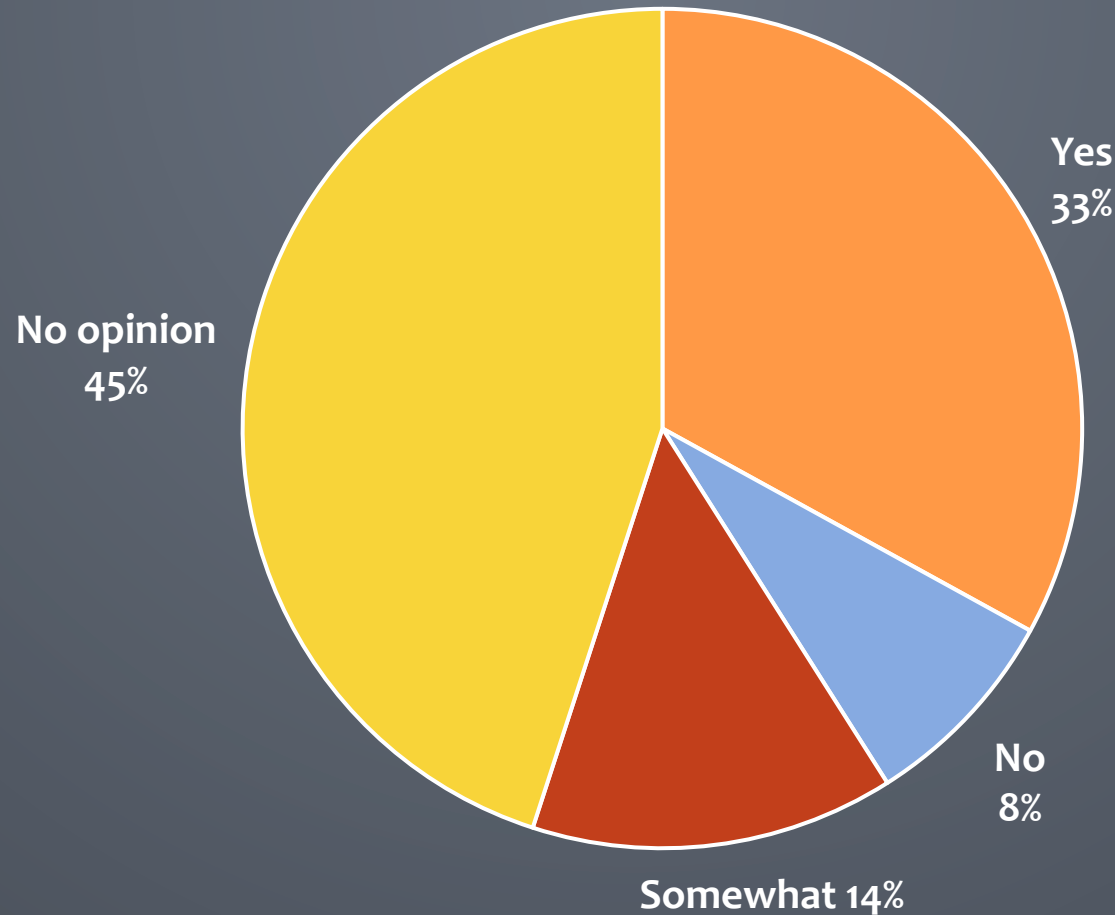

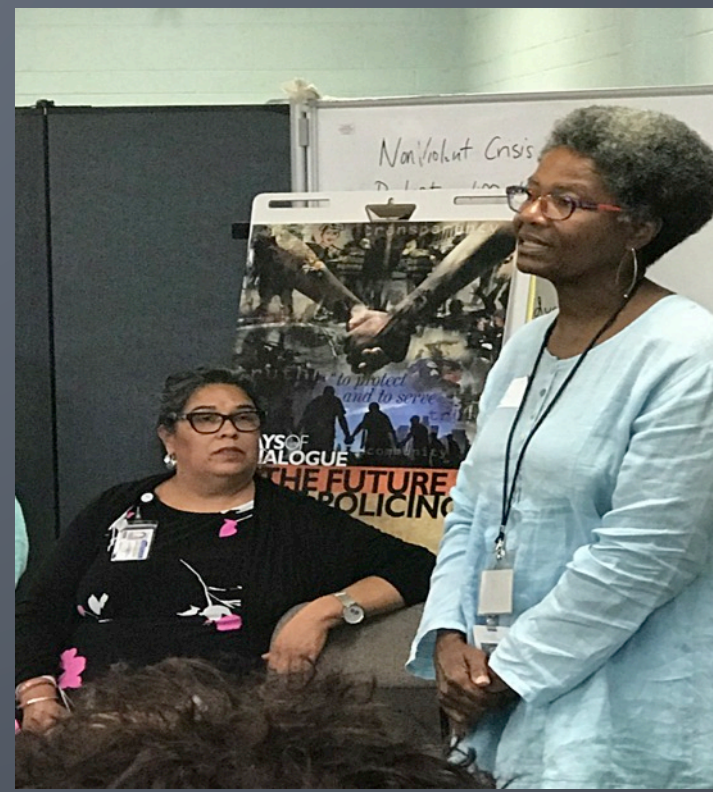


You have to know the background. Police are trying to work in communities, and build relationships with us, then they won't just come in and arrest us.

Sometimes the police come in and do good things.

Basically, they explained their tactics- get a call- somebody's on the run.

Even some of the cops- they get pressured by other cops like we get pressured, stopped when they are off duty.





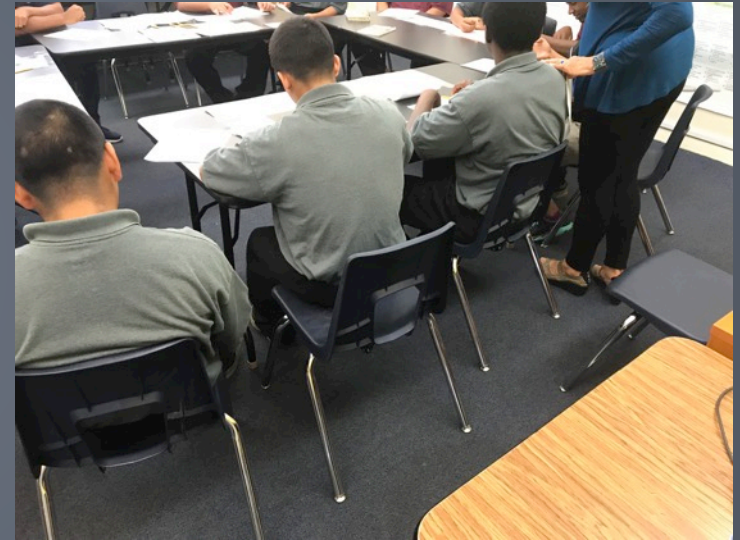
Probation officer saying:

The cop let me go. I don't know why.

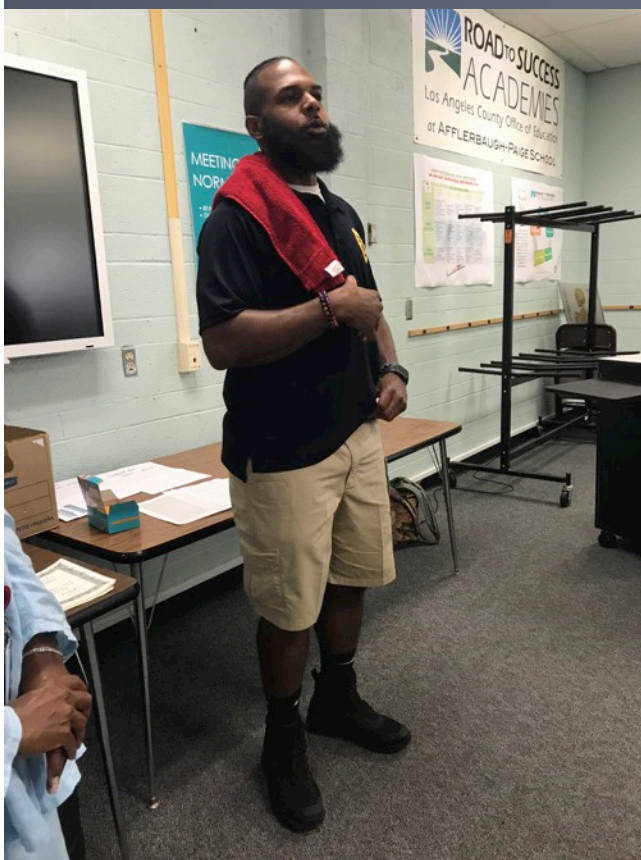
The cops are not always trying to get you."

We went around the room and asked each other to describe us. Who were you raised by? What did they teach us in life?



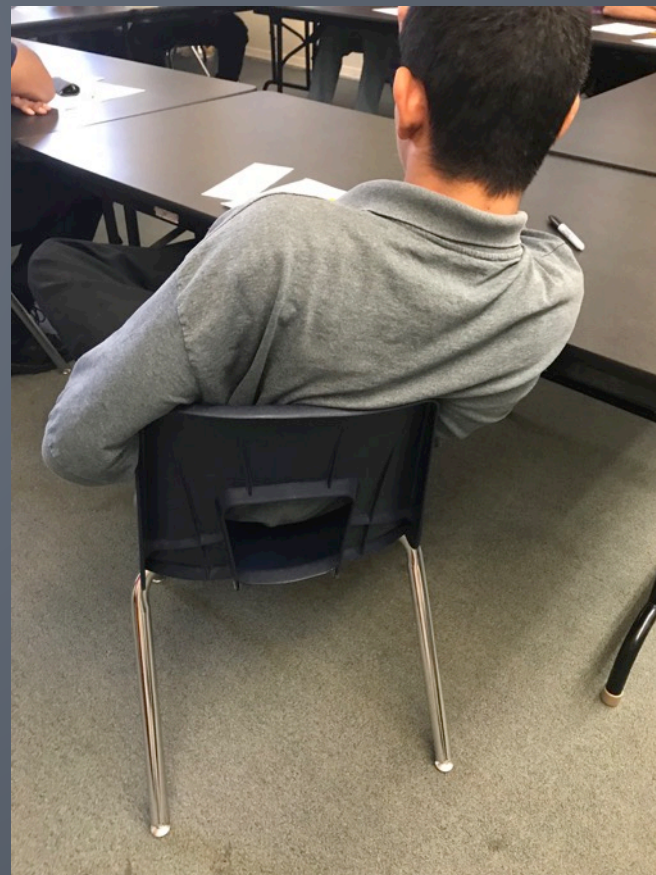
You don't always have to do a crime- don't always have to be doing something that you aren't supposed to be doing. You can get a job and take care of yourself.

I want to thank the police officers who came here today to talk to us. You put us here in jail, but it felt like you cared about us.



I really appreciated how they understood where we come from, and they didn't judge us for our past experiences in life.

I like how they gave us a little inside scoop – searching, procedures, encounters. “real talk”



Consensual encounter- can I talk to you? Officer speaks to you, doesn't ask for ID. You are free to leave.
Legal detention- you cannot leave.
