## DAYS OF DIALOGUE IS... FACILITATED DIALOGUE

- Structured Conversation
- The facilitator acts as a moderator,rather than a leader and is always neutral
- The purpose is to share Thoughts, Feelings, and Experiences in a safe and confidential space

## DIALOGUE PARTICIPANTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO...

- Express your opinions
- Listen to others
- Give everyone a chance to speak
- Respect the ground rules
- Respect each other

## **GROUND RULES**

- Speak openly and honestly
- Listen carefully and respectfully to each person
- Keep comments brief and stay focused on task
- Explore differences respectfully and look for common ground
- Trust that the facilitator has the best interest of the group at heart
- Silence cell phones
- Be respectful of the opinions of others


When comparing treatment of community members by law enforcement, do you believe that people of color are consistently treated less fairly by law enforcement officers than are white people?








Do you think that the process of dialogue is beneficial in addressing important issues in our community?





Have a male LAPD officer attend the session with the girls because their encounters are with male officers on the streets.

This was a controversial convo. There's both sides to law and citizens.

Not all cops are bad cops and we have to look at it from their side too. They have to make sure that they get home to their family.

Police officers do go through a lot, mostly negative, and it is mostly hard to deal with, for them

Most cops want to help, that's what they're here for. Not all cops are bad cops.

Everyone goes through some struggles. Throughout life. And not everyone has an education.

Nobody can put you down because you have self control over yourself.

I learned that almost everyone doesn't come from a wealthy family, with a bank account full of money for them.

Gotta work hard in life for what you want.

Learn not to let people get to you. Set boundaries.

Be a self learner.

We learned about – never back down on your hopes and dreams.

We learned about stereotyping and profiling. They go by what the radio says.

Know your rights. Body language counts- cops might stop you and ask you questions and then move on.

Talked about what the officer and the facilitator went through to get to where they got. Talked about life skills.

I learned that everybody has a bank account. Nobody can push you down if you have self control of yourself.

Having you guys around is a good experience for all the kids.

For many of the youth- it's the first time they had a conversation like this.

We all need to have these conversations.



- It's just good to know that there are people who are out there who are advocating  $\circ$  for you.
- Not all cops are out to get us, some of them are pretty nice.
- We have to look at why cops are cautious with us because we don't know who they are encountering.
- Some cops are rougher than others because they don't have social skills.
- Many things you can do- especially since you have been system involved- you can share your knowledge and get involved with the community.
